## notes by the composers

**Pre Lift-Off** ~ Check the fuel, get your keys, we're going down the rabbit hole for what seems like the millionth time, all systems go, yeah baby! Destination could be anywhere, Honolulu or western PA or even Guantanamo. You'll sit in your seat on the plane, mimosa resting on your tray, and wonder how you can break yourself out of this syndrome, this frenetic tendency to enjoy the moment before the drop more than the drop itself.

**Is This A Dream?** I keep having this recurring dream: I am you, sitting in the seats of the UVM Recital Hall. In my lap is a paper program, and in my ears is a piece with a time signature that I can't quite place. Everything seems normal, yet something is different. I sit back to listen and enjoy the music, and the dream continues...

**Second Suite for Wind Trio** is an exploration of each of the three voices as both soloists and accompanists through three varied styles, all inspired by the musical traditions of South America and the beauty of the transition of fall to winter here in Burlington: a waltz for the melancholy of falling leaves, a merengue for the joy of early snow, and a choro for the nostalgia of going home for the holidays.
