## To Professor Besaw,

He continuously publishes soulful and introspective new works including vulnerably intimate solo, unaccompanied works for cello and viola. Players want to interpret the compositions of David Feurzeig, and that is a rare feat in and of itself in today's musical landscape.

The last thing I want to touch on in this letter is Professor Feurzeig's advocacy. His sense of service and commitment to community is an indelible part of his personality. Behind the currents of classes, homework and exams, students notice and appreciate those values.
